Carrying the message in the Pacific islands

Our International Sponsorship Fund has paid for the printing of 2000 copies of a brochure in Fijian.

The brochure combines two AA pamphlets: *Is AA for you?* and *This is AA*. It was originally translated by GSO New Zealand in 1985. We updated the translation, got a Fijian to key-in the text so it is now in digital format, redesigned it and had it printed.

This is among several other projects in the Pacific region being funded by the ISF. The money for the ISF is given largely by groups in the period around Founders Day (June 10). The money is collected in brown paper bottle bags as a reminder of “what it was like”.

Other projects being funded by the ISF include:

- Translation and printing of of the Steps, Traditions and Serenity Prayer banners in Pijin for members in the Solomon Islands
- Translation and printing of banners of the Steps and Serenity Prayer for members in Samoa
- Sponsored a Solomons Island member to go to the Coffs Harbour Convention
- Sponsored a Bhutanese member to go to the AOSM meeting in Bangkok
- Translation of three pamphlets for the Solomon Islands– with two more to follow soon
- Together with GSO New York, translation of five pamphlets for Samoa

- Send shipments of literature to various countries in our region including Samoa, Vanuatu, Bhutan and Fiji.

Half Fiji's population is of Indian origin so we arranged to send a supply of literature in Hindi as well as a Steps banner in Hindi.

When the Fijian members opened the shipment of literature, they sent the following email message: "We of The Bula Group thank you with all our hearts for sending AA books, pamphlets and Banners to Fiji! Opening the Banners up in my house to have a look sent waves of intense joy through my very being. Imagine that: a *sober* rush of

The Steps, Traditions and Serenity Prayer have been translated into Pijin, the pidgin English used in the Solomon Islands. These have been printed on cloth to be used as banners at meetings in Honiara.

pure joy!! The Banners are most likely the very first AA Banners to ever arrive in this great and wonder-filled nation called Fiji.

"We are doing our best to get AA going here. We are 4 members just now welcoming in a 5th member and the outlook for the future of AA in Fiji is looking really fabulous these days."

Our World Service Delegates received a request from an Australian aid organisation operating in Uganda and the Congo. We put the organisation in touch with local AA groups. These groups told us they were terribly short of literature so the ISF paid for a shipment to be sent to them which was very gratefully received. Because these countries are outside the Asia Pacific zone, the approval of the Conference International Committee had to be gained before the literature could be sent.

Delegate

The General Service Conference to be held in November 2012 will elect a new World Service Delegate. Applications to stand for election are invited from members. The position is for a four-year term.

Qualifications:

Applicants should be legal residents and citizens of Australia.

They should have at least five years current unbroken sobriety in AA, and service experience at a national level.

They should have demonstrated leadership qualities, genuine service interest, organisational ability, and a knowledge and love of AA.

Responsibilities:

Attend two World Service Meetings and two Asia/Oceania Service Meetings in the four-year term of service.

Write a Country Report and/or Presentation for the World Service Meeting and Asia/Oceania Service Meeting. Be fully informed on AA in their countries and/or zones.

- Attend General Service Board meetings and the General Service Conference in Sydney each year.
- Attend the National Convention each year.
- Report to the Fellowship via Conference, Board meetings, AA Around Australia and AA Service meetings like Regional Forums, Area Assemblies and District Meetings the observations

the World Service Meeting and Asia-Oceania Service meeting.

- Actively support, help organise and inform the fellowship about the International Sponsorship Fund "Brown Paper Bag" collection held during Founders Week in June each year.

Applications must be received by no later than Friday 7th October 2011

2. General Service Trustee

The General Service Board of Alcoholics Anonymous Australia is seeking nominations for the position of General Service Trustee. The position is for four years, commencing 1st January 2012. General Service Trustee applicants should reside within commuting distance of the National Office.

Nominations will be considered when the Board meets in November 2011 and the successful candidate will be chosen by Third Legacy Procedure. The appointment of the successful candidate will then be ratified at the General Service Conference.

The trustee must also be available to attend the Board meeting and General Service Attend General Service Board meetings held at weekends in February and July. Conference is held over four days in November.

Would YOU send a shaky newcomer to an empty hall with a locked door?

Our website manager recently got this email message:

"Last night I turned up to a meeting I found on your website. I was upset to find it wasn't on because I am really struggling. A young woman also turned up and became very agitated that the meeting wasn't on. I am in early days and can't drive so I could only suggest that she try to find another meeting the next day. It turns out this meeting has been defunct for some months. It shouldn't be on the list."

What a terrible thing to do to newcomers! Imagine their confusion and desperation. Imagine their loss of faith in AA.

YOU can stop this happening to someone else. The website team can't do anything unless local members tell them of meeting closures and changed addresses and times.

You need to go to the website and check every meeting in your Area. Make sure all of them are still running and properly listed and there are no meetings that have been left off the list.

Check that the street maps have the "pin" placed in the right spot. Make sure the directions of how to get to the meeting place are clear and sufficient. If there's an error let us know immediately.

How to correct a mistake on the National Website

It's easy. Go to www.aa.org.au and click on "Find a meeting". You will see a big red button marked "Notice a mistake?" Click on that and then select whether it's a new meeting, closed meeting or just a change in details. Then just fill in the form.

It's a good time to think of AA's Responsibility Declaration:
